REPOA has a new organizational structure

In August of 2011, a new organisational structure was put in place at REPOA. The aim of the new structure is to achieve the more effective implementation of REPOA's activities and the newly developed outcome mapping and progress markers framework.

In the new structure, activities are implemented by the three main themes of the Strategic Plan (Economic Growth, Social Protection and Governance). The intention is to have each directorate manage strategic research, commissioned studies, research grants and training activities in its respective areas. This will allow each directorate to specialise in order to deepen knowledge in the respective areas, while also permitting the creation of synergies between research, commissioned studies, grants and training activities within each theme.

In the past, research programmes were implemented under the departments of Strategic Research and Commissioned Studies with training and grants activities managed under their own departments.

Other changes include the combination of Communications, IT and Library functions into one department (Information and Communications Services); adding Grants, Commissioned Work and M&E and Learning functions under Programmes and Support, and transferring the Human Resource and Administration functions to the Finance department to form the Finance and Administration department.

Launching AGRA's Policy Hub for Tanzania



Alliance for a Green Revolution in Africa (AGRA) was launched at the Movenpick Hotel in Dar es Salaam. REPOA was selected to host a Hub for the Policy initiative supported by AGRA. The hub initiative aims at strengthening policy research design and implementation and policy support systems to enhance productivity in agriculture and the entire agricultural product value chain for staple food crops in Tanzania. AGRA has similar initiatives in three other Sub-Saharan African countries; Ghana, Mali and Mozambique.


In memory of Dr. Raymond Mnenwa

Coming Soon – PHDR 2011

(Mkakati wa Kukuza Uchumi na Kupunguza Umaskini, commonly known by its Swahili acronym, MKUKUTA/ MKUKUTA II). This year's theme will be on the business environment for enhancing employment and productivity for more inclusive growth and more effective poverty reduction.

The report will provide an expanded analysis of the trends and outcomes in national development as well as discussion of important socio-economic issues facing the country. As in the previous

editions, the PHDR 2011 will include a status chapter organized around the three MKUKUTA

clusters namely (i) status of income poverty, (ii) status of social wellbeing and (iii) status of governance and accountability.


held a training session for various members of the media with the objectives of building their capacity in packaging research findings for specific audiences; making stories accessible and clear

without compromising accuracy; undertaking the appropriate level of background research;

appropriately linking research findings with current policy issues; and building effective relationships with research institutions. The training was beneficial to junior and senior journalists who report on political, governance, social and economic issues. A total of 29 junior and senior journalists participated in the workshop. These journalists came from 17 media houses which included print, television and radio. The workshop was held in December
